Moderate winds from
N.E. with rain steering
S. W. winds

Friday Mar. 24th
Moderate winds
from E. S. S. E. steering W.
at 4 p.m. saw the land
wind chopped around S. W.
were ship heading S. E. by
S. all day thick fog & rain
so ends.

Saturday Mar. 25
Strong winds
from S. S. W. ship head-
ing S. E. at 7 p.m.
were ship heading in to the
S. W. so ends
Sat. at noon 47-28
D.R. Son at 4 p.m. 70-50

Sunday Mar 26th
Moderate winds
from S. S. W. at 2 p.m.
Ship on different tack so ends

Lat 47-42 S.
Lon at 2 p.m. 169-10 E.

Monday Mar. 27.

Moderate winds

tack so ends
at 2 p.m. Lat 48-00 S.
do - - Lon 168 40 E.

Tuesday Mar 28th
Strong winds from
W. S. S. ship on different
tack at 4 p.m. sighted
the Sires and passed them
at 8. steering N. W. so ends

at 4 p.m. Lat 48-25 S.
at 4 p.m. Lon 166-58 E.



Wednesday Mar. 29th
Light winds from
W. S. S. ship on Northern
Tack at 6 p.m. saw a school
of sperm whales going quick
to the S. W. at dark lowered
two boats without success
shorten sail so ends Sat. 47-09
