Friday April 21st

Light winds from N. with smooth weather, saw the land at 2. p.m. heavy blows settled over it. at dark shorten sail heading N.W.W. so ends
Lat at noon 43-35. S

Saturday April 22nd

Moderate winds from N. with thick rainy weather
So. Ends.

Sunday April 23rd

First part, strong winds from S.E. S.W. and moderate. Latter light winds & calm. Milford Sound, Barreling C.S.C. Dis 15 m at dark, shorten sail, Barque & Schooner in sight so ends.

Monday April 24

First part light air and calm. Middle part strong winds, & latter part moderate gales from S. ship heading W.S.W. at 6. close reefed the main topsail. one sail in sight land in sight so ends this day

Tuesday April 25th

Moderate gales from the S. ship on different tacks, so ends

Wednesday April 26th

First part strong winds from S. ship heading C.S.C. middle part light. Latter part calm. at dark shorten sail so ends

Lat 43-54. S.

Thursday April 27th

Light winds from N.N.E. ship on different tacks at 3. p.m. spoke the Barque Commodore Pomroy Robert town 2 m out abeam. there has been nothing seen here as yet. I am going of shore to have a look see whether ship steering W. by N. so ends

Friday April 28th

Moderate gales from N. steering W. Latter part heavy second S.W. ship heading W.N.W. so ends

Saturday April 29th

Strong winds from S.E. S.W. ship heading W. by N. at dark shortened sail so ends
