with a low Barometer, 29.125, some
rain so ends.

Wednesday, May 17. th

Moderate gales from
N.W. with rain, B. S.W. so ends

Tuesday May 18. th

Moderate gales
from S.W. ship heading
different courses so ends

Sat 44.08 S.

Friday May 19. th

Strong gales from
S.W. Land in sight
Ship close reef, top sails
so ends

Saturday fresh gales from
S.W. with heavy squalls
of rain and sleet, one sail
in sight so ends

Ship Robert Edwards of N.B. 1858

Friday May 26 th

Commenced with moderate
gales from S.W. at 1. p.m.
gales moderated ship and
different tacks, so ends

P.S. S.W. gales up to this
day

Saturday May 27. th

Whisk breezes from N.W.
with thick rainy weather
Ship steering different courses
at dusk shorten sail, so ends

Sunday May 28. th

Moderate wind
from N.E. with thick
rainy weather, & a heavy
S.W. swell at 7. am raised
sperm whales going quick
to S.W. lowered without
success at 11. am lost sight
of the whales at 3. p.m. saw
them again coming off to
leeward lowered, shut in thick
fog came on board Milford
sound bearing E. dis 3. m
so ends

Sat 44-22. S.
