

Abstract of the Whaling Voyages

Sunday, June 4th

Moderate winds from S.W. steering different courses at 7. At 8 saw a sail, steering in N.E. all hands employed in boiling at dark shifted main top sail & shortened sail so ends. Lat 44-48

Monday, June 5th

Strong winds from N.E. with rain squalls all hands employed in boiling so ends.

Tuesday, June 6th

Strong wind from N.E. with rain at 1. At 3 in finish boiling at 8. At 10 broke out the main top to stow down, checked it off at dark leaving 15 lbs on deck so ends.

Wednesday, June 7th

Moderate gales from S.E. S.W. with rain ship on Easter tack at 4. At 7 saw a barque on Western tack so ends.

Thursday, June 8th

Strong winds from the S.W. with rain squalls at 7. At 8 a boat from Whaling barque Kunnamede came along side to get some lime, all hands employed in stowing provision, so ends. Land in sight shortened sail at dark so ends.

Friday, June 9th

Strong winds from the S.W. with rain squalls ship on different tacks. Barque Kunnamede in sight at dark shortened sail so ends.

Saturday, June 10th

Moderate winds from the S.W. At 8 saw the Barque Kunnamede a Whaling, kept the ship off for her so ends at dark shortened sail.

Sunday, June 11th

Moderate gales from the S.W. with rain ship on different tacks so ends.
