

Abstract of Whaling Voyage in

Monday Aug. 14th
at 10 a.m. took
the ancor and put to sea with a
light wind from S. came out the W.
passage, humpbacks were shy and
hard to strike, have sank two seaweed
from two and lost two with lines
so ends.

Tuesday, Aug. 15th

Light winds from E, S, E
ship steering S, S, W.
So ends

Wednesday Aug. 17th

Moderate winds from
E, S, E, ship steering in to the
S, S, W. at 5 p.m. sighted
Rock reefs and passed them
steering S. Lat at 5 p.m. $22=10$
Long do $155=35$
So ends

Friday, Aug. 18th

Moderate winds from
S, S, E, S, S, E at 4 p.m. found
that both Chronometers had run
down. Wound up and started one
of them, having got the G. time by
Calculation. Son by G. $155=06.6$

Ship Robert Edwards of N.B. 1868

Saturday Aug. 19th

Moderate winds from
E, S, E. Ship on different tack
at 3 p.m. sighted Catala bank
Chro being some ten miles to the
Westward. Killed two hogs
so ends. Lat at 4 p.m. $23=13.9$
Long do $155=18.2$

Sunday Aug 20th

Moderate winds from
E, S, E, ship on different tack
sighted Catala banks raised Chro
shorten sail at dark
Lat $23=18$
Long $155=33=30$

Monday Aug. 21st

Light winds
from E, S, E, S, E, ship on different
tack at dark shorten sail, so ends

Tuesday Aug. 22nd

Light & baffling
winds ship on different tack
saw a school of Black fish at dark
shorten sail, so ends

Wednesday Aug. 23rd

All this day Calm
saw porpoises and grampuses &
black fish so ends. Lat $23=58$
Long $154=41$
