Fresh Breezes from

at 11. p.m. Wind came in
W. S.W. and blew fresh for
12. p.m. and dried out

Moderate gales from W.
ship under close reef main top sail
at 11. p.m. wind moderated, made
sail so ends. Lat 29-32 / 155-4

Moderate winds from
N.W. to S.W. steering S. S.E.
So. Ends. this day

Lat. 30-44
Wednesday, Aug. 30th
Moderate winds from
N. S.W. steering S. S.E. all
hands employed in mending
sail. So. Ends.
Lat. 32-12
Long = 156-43

Thursday, Aug. 31st
Moderate Winds
from W. S.W. ship steering
different courses, at 5. p.m.
wind shifted to the S. and again
to the S.W. then S.E. with
thunder, lightning and rain
took in sail to a close reef main
top sail. so ends

Lat. 33-12.
Long. 156-27
Friday, Sept. 1st

First part, calms
Latter part moderate winds from
N. steering S. S.E. at dark time
Reefed the top sails so ends
at 3. p.m. took a linner C. B.
Lat. 33-29 S.
Long. 156-31 E.
Long. 156-41 Gunol, C. B.
