Sunday Sept. 10. th
 all this day Strong
 winds from N. ship steering different
 courses, in Lat = 36 = 20 S. Lon. 152 = 21.
 Saw Finbacks and quantities of
 Whale. Birds at dark saw two
 Schools of porpoises took in sail
 so ends. Lat at 5. p.m.

36 = 45 is
 Lon - do - do - 152 = 13 6

Monday Sept. 11. th
 All this day calms
 Beached a Barque from Stahito bound
 to Milbourn. at dark got two
 porpoises, took in sail. So ends

Tuesday Sept. 12. th
 All this day gales
 From N. ship under close sails
 heading on Star tack so ends

Wednesday 13. th
 gale still continues
 Wind from N. S.W. to S.S.W.
 Ship on different tacks so ends

Thursday 14. th
 gale moderated Winds
 the same, made some sail, ship head-
 ing N.W. got a porpoise, saw
 several, chook, so ends.

at 4. p.m. Lat. 36 = 43
 do do - Long 152 = 35 = 30

Ship Robert Edwards N.B. = 1865

Friday Sept. 15. th
 First part moderate
 winds from the S. S.W. latter
 light, and baffling, heading
 N. shorten sail at dark so ends
 Lat 36.09, S
 Lon 152.00 = 30.6

Saturday Sept. 16. th
 All this day
 Light Winds and calms. Beached
 the Swedish Barque Elizabeth
 from Newcastle with coals, for St. John's
 shorten sail at dark, so ends
 Lat 36.41 S.
 Lon 151.00 E.

Sunday Sept. 17. th
 Moderate winds
 from S. ship on different tacks
 at dark shorten sail, so ends
 at 4. p.m. Lon 150.40
 at 4. p.m. Lat 36 = 38

Monday Sept. 18. th
 All this day Calms
 & light winds. One sail in sight
 so ends at dark shorten sail, so ends
 Lat at 4. p.m. 36 = 54.3
 Lon do - do 151 = 13.6
