

Abstract of A. Whaling Voyage in

19. Tuesday, Light winds and calms, several sail in sight.

Sat, 37-8
Sun, 151-30

Wednesday Sept. 20th

Moderate winds from N. ship on different tacks saw several sail, at 8. pm Cape Horn bearing W. dis. 16. m. cald. Is. Light bearing N. W. at dusk ship's head, N. E. so ends

Thursday Sept. 21st

First part Moderate winds from N. ship on different tacks, at 12. m. wind hauled to the S. steering N. S. and dis 20. so ends saw several sail,

Friday Sept. 22nd

First part Wind baffling at 12. m. Moderate breeze from the N. E. ship heading N. W. at 5. tacked ship heading E. at 6. calm Land Dis. 16. m.

Saturday Sept. 23

Wind N. E. S. E. & E. ship steering in to the N. W. at dusk more ship head off shore jaws lay light bearing N. dis. 8. m so ends

Ship Robert Edwards of N. B. 1865

Sunday Sept. 24th

Moderate gals from N. W. W. S. S. W. at 12. came to anchor in jaws bay so ends.

Monday Sept. 25th

Moderate winds from N. and S. got off 120 lbs water so ends.

Tuesday Sept. 26.

First part calm, at 3. pm a light N. E. wind at 4. pm took the anchor and worked out pass the head at 6. pm steering E. S. E. so ends

Sun. 152-

Wednesday Sept. 27th

Strong winds from S. W. and squally, ship heading in to the East end so ends

Thursday Sept. 28th

Strong winds with heavy squalls from S. with dirty threatening weather ship on, even tack so ends

Friday, Sept. 29.

Weather the same few sail in sight
