Saturday Sept 30th

Moderate winds from the N.W. Ship on different tacks saw several fin-backs, & one sail, & seals, shorten sail.

at 4. pm Lat 38-57, S.

Sunday, Oct. 1. st

Strong winds from S.W. & N.W. heading in to the S. weather thick and hazy shorten sail at dark so ends.

Monday Oct 2. nd

Strong winds from S.W. ship heading S.S.E. hazy weather, shorten sail at dark so ends.

Lat, 37-14,

Long, 157-38,

Tuesday Oct 3. rd

Strong winds from S.W. & N.W. ship steering different courses so ends this day shorten sail

Lat at 4. pm 37-47

Long 157-36

Wednesday Oct. 4th

Moderate winds from N.W. & N.E. ship on North-east tack at dark shorten sail so ends

Lat at 5. pm 36-44

Tuesday Oct. 10. th

Thick weather & Strong winds from N.W. at 10. am saw two schools of Blackfish, one school of porpoises going quick to westward North-east ship on different tacks, shorten sail at dark so ends.

Wednesday Oct. 11. th

Moderate winds from S.S.W. ship steering different courses, saw a large piece of squid & several smaller pieces, many gulls, & mullinets, at dark shorten sail so ends

Lat, 35-41

Long, 153-20

Thursday Oct. 12th

Moderate winds from S.S.W. ship on different tacks, shorten sail at dark so ends

Lat 35-40.5

Long 153-57.8

Friday Oct. 13. th

Light winds from S.S.E. ship heading S.W. at 5.4 pm saw Blackfish and porpoises so ends shorten sail

Lat at 11. am 35-54

Long, at 9. am 156-36
