Sunday Nov. 26th

Moderate winds from
the N.W. ship on different tracks
at 7. am lowered for a right whale
came on board without success at
4-p.m. lowered again some luck,
so ends

Monday Nov. 27th
moderate winds from S.E. at 9. am
lowered for a right whale came on
board at 11. am without success
at 2 p.m. lowered again for four whales
Bow Boat struck whale took his line
M.B. struck him again at 4 took him
to the ship got ready for cutting
So ends

Sat = 41-29
Son. 153-24

Tuesday Nov. 28. at 11 am finish
cutting, made sail heading S.W.
So ends

Sat 41-11
Son 153-34

Wednesday Nov. 29. at 6. am
lowered for a right whale M.B.
struck S.B. cut his line with iron
Weather calm and clear whale went
in to the S.E. M.B. struck him
again and saved him killed him
about 11. m to S.E. of ship at 2. p.m.
ship got a light breeze took him
along side at 5. p.m.
So ends.

Ship Robert Edwards of N.B. 1865
Thursday Nov. 30th Light winds
from S.E. M.B. at 4. p.m. heaving
on to cut at 10. finish cutting, made
sail, saw a right whale did not lower
at 12. broke out to stow down, so ends

Friday Dec. 1. st

Light S. baffling
Winds all hands employed in stowing
down & boiling, finish stowing down
at dark and shorten sail, so ends

Sat 41-11

Saturday Dec. 2. st

Strong winds
With thick rainy weather, at times
ship steering different courses, saw
plenty of right whale porpoises
So ends

Sunday Dec. 3. st

Strong winds &
moderate gales from S.W. finish
boiling at 6. am & finish stowing
down at 12. mid. ship under close
reef main topsails heading S.E.
so ends at 4. p.m. Sat 41-43

do. " " Long 154-54

Monday Dec. 4. st

All this day moderate
gales from S.W. ship heading
S.E. all hands employed in
scrapping down, so ends

Sat at 5 p.m. 42-16
Son " 155-43
