Thursday Dec. 5. H

Light S. Winds & calms at 11. A.M. saw a Right Whale going in to the S.W. saw great quantities of Right Whale porpoises hands employed in mending sail and loam so ends Sat at 4 p.m. 41-40

Wednesday Dec. 6. H

Fresh breezes from N. at 6. A.M. set in heavy rain with light baffling winds, hands employed in mending ship, latter part wind came in S.W. and held sailing, made sail stowed off S.E. by 6. saw two Right Whales going in S.W. at dusk shorten sail so ends.

Thursday Dec. 7. H

all this day moderate gales from the S.W. ship on Southern tack, so ends

Sat. 41-39.

Long, 156-13.6.

Friday Dec. 8. H

Light Winds from S.W. at 9. A.M. saw a sperm Whale going quick to windward forward without success, ship on different tack, at dusk shorten sail so ends Sat 41-32.5

Saturday, Dec. 9. H

Fresh breezes from N. ship steering S.E. S.W. hands employed in mending. Bore at dusk shorten sail & came to wind heading E.N.E. so ends

Sat at 4 p.m. 42-35

Sunday Dec. 10. H

First part Winds variable, weather cloudy at 11. More ship in to S.W. Got part Winds fresh from N.W. shorten sail at dusk Sat at 4 p.m. 43-15.0

Long do. 154-30.0

Monday Dec. 11. H

Fresh breezes from N.W. at 11. A.M. shifted sudden to S.W. ship on Western tack shorten sail at dusk so ends

Sat at 4 p.m. 42-46
