

Abstract of a Whaling Voyage in ship

Sunday Dec. 24th

Light Winds from S.W. & S. at 9. it was seen a Right Whale to Windward Toward Shore boats at 10.4. S.B. struck a hump back to the ship at 1.1. A p.m. hooked on at 3. finish cutting at 7. and cleared up deck. Wind N.W. strong & squally at 9. came in S.W. ship on Western tack so ends

Sat at Noon 43-34.

Monday Dec. 25th

All this day strong winds from S.W. & S. & squally weather ship on Western tack all hands employed in setting up stocks at dusk passed a ship steering in S.E. so ends

Sat at 4 p.m. 42-35.6
Long do. 153-51.6

Robert Edmunds of N.B. 1865 Dec 26
All this day moderate winds from N.W. & S.W. weather clear all hands employed in setting up stocks & boiling tallow. Capt. seaman off duty sick, so ends

Sat 42-18 at Noon

Wednesday Dec. 27th

All this day moderate winds from the N. and alive ship on different tacks finish boiling at 1. A.M. all hands employed in towing down at 7 p.m. Capt. the ship of W.S.W. so ends

Sat at 4 p.m. 41-35.3
Long " 152-27.6

Thursday Dec 28

Light and baffling Winds with some rain all hands employed in scraping bone. Got the part fresh breezes from S and clear weather ship heading N.W. so ends

Sat at 6 p.m. 42-27. Sun 149-40
