

Abstract of Whaling Voyage in Ship

Robert Edwards, of N. B. 1865

Friday Dec. 29th
All this day light
winds & Calms at daylight sighted
Naumkians Land all hands employed
in setting up shovels, so, ends
Sat at 5. p.m. 42-50
Long 148-28

Saturday Dec. 30th
All this day light winds
and Calms at 6.1 a.m. saw several
sperm. whales heading in to the
land. lowered three boats, chased the
whales off out of sight of ship. at
about Noon W.B. went on, mist
the whale and got stove bad.
Charles Robinson boatwrecked mist
took up the stove boat at
about 4. p.m. saw a large merchant
ship steering N. by E. Sailed
N. N. W. Whales gone off to the N. W.
6. at dusk took in light sails so, 6

Sat at Noon 43-09
Long

Sunday Dec. 31st
All this day
light baffling winds & Calms
saw one sail. Cape Pittor bearing
N. N. W. dis. 28 m. shorter sail
at dusk so, ends

Monday Jan. 1, 1866.
First & middle part
light winds from N. E.
 Latter, strong winds wind
from S. W. S. S. W. at dusk
took in canvas & put close
reefed main & fore top sail
ship heading S. by E. all
hands employed in setting up
shovels and mending boats so
ends Sat at 6. p.m.
