of the loss of some 16. sail of vessels
in the last Easter gale, over one hundred
lives lost

Thursday July 24. th
Lost down main
yard found it rotten. sent up new
yard. Winds Strong W. Clear

Friday July 25. th
at 9. A. M. Took one
anchor, & put to sea with light winds, W.

of New Bedford

Aug. 15. th
Moderate winds from
W. ship heading in to floors ish
at 4. p. m. Went on shore with
boat crew ship stood off to S. W.
so bad

Aug. 17. th came to
anchor on the East side of
the Isle, in 30 fath. water so bad

Aug. Saturday 18. th

Took off potatoes 59.42
onions 1292, W. pork on foot
706, W.

Aug. Sunday 19. th

Wind S. E. Took
the anchor came around West
side. Cap. Harrison. Bayne
Walter wrote came on board
had a bad foot

Aug. Monday 20. th
stood to see wind
S. Clear. so bad
