Not being competent to do his duties after having disobeyed and allowing his boatmen to influence him that he was the cause of losing a whale to the ship in June of 1880 being no Whaler nor officer he was told that he would not be allowed to head a boat any longer but could stay in the ship until such time as she reached a port of entry and thus receive his discharge. He said he preferred to leave at Long Island or it was mutually agreed once he took his things and went ashore.

A saving to the ship in food for he was perfect - useful so far as Whaling as the duties of an officer is concerned.
