

Remarks On board B. H. Robert. Morris. A.D. 1851

Wednesday

April 14th First of these 24 hours hazy weather & moderate breezes weighed anchor and went as far as ten Pelise Cove then came to Anchor in 1 fathoms water so ends this day

Thursday

April 15th First of these 24 hours clear weather & light variable winds & calms weighed Anchor again today but soon dropped it again so ends this day

Friday

April 16th First of these 24 hours fine weather & a moderate breeze from N.E. at 9 A.M. took our anchor & set went to sea saw one steamer at 5 P.M. it shot in thick foggy so ends this day

Saturday

April 17th First of these 24 hours frequent squalls hands employed in various jobs but decks saw one steamer mid & latter parts weather much the same so ends
Lat 34.11

Sunday

April 18th First of these 24 hours strong breezes from the Northwest Bark steering N.E. by E mid & latter parts much the same at 1 P.M. raised a school of small whales going quick to windward made sail in chase so ends this day
Lat 36.48 Long 66.36

Monday

April 19th First of these 24 hours strong & variable wind at 1 P.M. lowered for the whales the S.D. darted at one but did not get fast it being a poor chance soon after the H. Ketruck killed him & took him to the ship mid & latter parts fine weather with but a big swell running at half past 4 A.M. heaved in and began cutting finished at 11 A.M. so ends this day

Tuesday

April 20th First of these 24 hours fine weather & light variable winds hands employed boiling mid & latter parts light winds from N.W. saw one sail so ends Lat 37.26 Long 63.26

Wednesday

April 21st First of these 24 hours fine weather hands employed boiling mid part strong breezes latter part blowing & gale from N.E. with much rain fresh & herman & John & first man off duty sick so ends this day

Thursday

April 22nd First of these 24 hours blowing & gale from N.E. with much rain ship laying to mid part weather much the same latter part fine weather saw 2 sail ship steering different courses so ends Lat 36.50 Long 62.51

Friday

April 23rd First of these 24 hours fine weather & N.W. wind Bark steering N.E. hands employed in various jobs but decks mid & latter parts weather much the same saw one sail so ends this day
Lat 36.05 Long 61.45

Saturday

April 24th First of these 24 hours fine weather Bark steering different courses mid & latter parts strong breeze from the Westward Bark steering E by S so ends
Lat 35.54 Long 60.08

Sunday

April 25th First of these 24 hours hazy weather & a strong breeze from the Westward Bark steering E by S at dark luffed to the wind John & first man came on duty to day mid & latter parts weather much the same so ends this day

Monday

April 26th First of these 24 hours thick hazy weather mid & latter parts much the same so ends this day
