

Remarks On board Bk Robert Morrison

Sunday

May 7th First of these 24 hours fine weather & light N.E. wind Bk steering by the wind at 4 P.M. raised Sperd Whales going quick to N.W. lowered for them but could not get abt dark came on board & shortened sail mid & latter parts weather much the same at 6 A.M. raised whales going quick at 10 lowered for them the Sps went on & struck boat 12 so ends this day

Monday

May 10th First of these 24 hours fine weather & Easterly wind took Sps whale to the ship at half past 3 and got ready to cut finished cutting at 4 P.M. mid & latter parts weather much the same hands employed boiling so ends this day Lat 34.18 Long 55.02

Tuesday

May 11th First of these 24 hours fine weather & calms finished boiling at 4 P.M. mid & latter parts weather much the same so ends this day Joseph & her mate remains the same

Wednesday

May 12th First of these 24 hours fine weather & light variable wind Bk steering by the wind on differ ent to his hands employed breaking out and stowing down mid & latter parts weather much the same so ends this day Lat 34.27 Long 54.24

Thursday

May 13th First of these 24 hours fine weather & a moderate breeze from the Westward picked up 2 bales of Cotton to day at dark shortened sail mid & latter parts cloudy weather & a strong breeze from the Southward so ends this day Lat 34.40 Long 54.13

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Friday

May 14th First of these 24 hours cloudy weather & a strong breeze from the Southward Bk steering by the wind saw 2 seamore one sail also saw whitewater ran for it but never saw it again mid & latter parts strong breezes saw several sail so ends this day Lat 34.56 Long 54.05

Saturday

May 15th First of these 24 hours cloudy weather & a strong breeze from the Southward saw several sail and some Porpoises got one at dark shortened sail mid part strong breeze latter part blowing a gale from N.W. ship laying to so ends no Cts

Sunday

May 16th First of these 24 hours blowing a gale from N.W. ship laying to under close reefed main topsail & fore topmast staysail on port tack mid & latter parts weather more moderate made more sail one sail in sight so ends this day Lat 35.27 Long 53.18

Monday

May 17th First of these 24 hours fine weather and a moderate breeze from the Northward Bk steering by the wind lowered a Boat & boarded the American Bark Seaworse of New York from Hamburg bound to New York at dark shortened sail mid & latter parts fine weather lowered & got a Kettle to day so ends this day

Tuesday

May 18th First of these 24 hours fine weather & a moderate breeze from the Westward Bk steering by the wind on Starboard tack at dark shortened sail mid & latter parts strong breeze from N.W. hands employed breaking out & stowing down saw one sail so ends this day Lat 34.18 Long 54.05
