July 15th. First of these 24 hours fine weather & a fresh breeze from the Southward R V steering by the wind saw jumpers at dark shortened sail mid & latter parts strong S W wind Joseph & Harman off duty sick Charles & Smith still in Irons so ends this day

July 16th. First of these 24 hours hazy weather & a fresh breeze from S W saw several sail to day at dark shortened sail mid & latter parts moderat breeze so ends this day

July 20th. First of these 24 hours fine weather & moderate breeze from the Southward R V steering S W W mid & latter parts the same Joseph & Harman off duty sick so ends this day Lat 36.10 Long 50.30

Wednesday
July 21st. First of these 24 hours fine weather & light N E winds R V steering W S W saw Porpoises mid & latter parts the same so ends this at 8 A.M. raised & permed Whales lowered for them the S W struck killed him so ends this day no obs

Thursday
22nd. First of these 24 hours fine weather & Easterly wind took our whale to the ship Boats still in chase of more whales at 3 P.M. the S B went on and started at one the whale saw the Boat and retted and the Irons second rowed it was a poor chance chased them & spell then came on board & began cutting worked off at 2 P.M. mid & latter parts weather the same hooked on & cut off our whales head & roled his body in by moor so ends this day
