Saturday  
Aug 28<sup>th</sup> First of these 24 hours fine weather & westerly winds hands employed breaking out & Coopering oil mid part the same latter part rained finished Coopering to day so ends

Sunday  
Aug 29<sup>th</sup> First of these 24 hours hazy weather & westerly winds sent our oil on shore to day mid part fine latter part blowing heavy from N.E with heavy rain so ends this day & barboard watch

Monday  
Aug 30<sup>th</sup> First of these 24 hours blowing hard from N.E with heavy rain mid part more moderate latter part fine weather the 4<sup>th</sup> Mate Mr James & two of the fore most boats deserted their man's are Joseph. Matchett & Manuel Johnson. Mr King

Tuesday  
Aug 31<sup>st</sup> First of these 24 hours fine weather & light variable winds hands employed breaking out and stowing the ground tier mid & latter parts weather the same so ends this day

Wednesday  
Sept 1<sup>st</sup> First of these 24 hours fine weather light variable wind & calm hands employed breaking out & stowing down mid & latter parts the same at 9 hours PM three of the crew attempted to desert but was caught and put in irons so ends this day their names are Andrew Cooper Boatsteerer who had the watch at the time Williams. McCarthy Cook and while making our second anchor the horse pipes were so poor that the chains cut through the Port one

Sept 2<sup>nd</sup> First of these 24 hours fine weather & light southerly winds finished Coopering to day mid & latter parts the same Charles Smith & William McCarthy Cook & one Bravo. Portuguese deserted last night so ends

Friday  
Sept 3<sup>rd</sup> First of these 24 hours fine weather & light southerly wind hands employed in various jobs bent decks discharged Mr King the second Mate to day mid part weather the same latter part rained so ends

Saturday  
Sept 4<sup>th</sup> First of these 24 hours strong Northward by wind at 2 P.M. took over anchor & went to sea mid & latter parts blowing fresh so ends this day shipped 4 men today John Brass Scot 38 29 John Fernand

Sunday  
Sept 5<sup>th</sup> First of these 24 hours fine weather & light variable winds B.W. steering different courses gained with B.W. Duncal Webster Capt Borden 40 months out 1700 lbs all told mid & latter parts the same saw 2 sail to day so ends this day Scot 35 39

Monday  
Sept 6<sup>th</sup> First of these 24 hours fine weather & strong Southward by winds B.W. steering different courses saw one sail at dark shortened sail St George bore 10 miles distant mid & latter parts weather the same so ends this day Scot 39 41 Long 25 18

Tuesday  
Sept 7<sup>th</sup> First of these 24 hours fine weather & light variable winds B.W. steering by the wind land in sight all day also saw 2 sail mid & latter parts the same so ends this day Scot 38 51
