Wednesday

March 16th First of these 24 hours fine weather & variable wind hands employed breaking out mid & latter parts the same so ends this day

Thursday

March 17th First of these 24 hours fine weather & light variable wind hands employed breaking out & cooping provisions mid part weather the same latter part raining so ends this day

Friday

March 18th First of these 24 hours cloudy weather & variable winds hands employed breaking out & cooping Provisions mid & latter parts the same so ends this day

Saturday

March 19th First of these 24 hours fine weather & S W wind finished cooping over Provisions to day mid part the same latter part blowing fresh so ends this day

Sunday

March 20th First of these 24 hours fine weather & S W wind mid & latter parts the same so ends this day

Monday

March 21st First of these 24 hours fine weather & Southard by wind mid & latter parts weather much the same sent a raft of deck ashore to day for water so ends this day

Tuesday

March 22nd First of these 24 hours fine weather & a fresh breeze from S W hands employed in various jobs boat deck mid & latter parts the same so ends this day

Wednesday

March 23rd First of these 24 hours fine weather & Southard by wind hands employed pulling water cask & painting ship mid & latter parts weather the same got off a raft of water to day so ends this day

Thursday

March 24th First of these 24 hours fine weather & Easterly wind stood over water sent the Cask in for more mid & latter parts weather the same sent our Boats crew on shore to day for liberty hands busily employed boat deck so ends this day two men came on board to day that had shipped there names

Friday

March 25th First of these 24 hours fine weather & light Easterly wind hands employed rafting water & doing other jobs sent the Boat after liberty men at night but three of them did not come off there names are Lewis Parker & Thomas. Malony & John G. & a lion mid & latter parts weather much the same sent an other Boats crew in on liberty to day so ends this day

Saturday

March 26th First of these 24 hours fine weather & light variable wind hands busily employed boat deck & got off a raft of water to day at sunset sent a Boat after the liberty men all returned but three 2 foremast hands & one Boatstearer David Lense by name who refused to come off & was locked up the men have deserted there names are William & James & William Johnson sent the Boat in to day & took David Lense on board also sent an other Boats crew on liberty so ends

Sunday

March 27th First of these 24 hours fine weather & S W wind hands employed in various jobs boat deck got off a raft of water to day at night sent a Boat for the men and found that three more had deserted William A. Pannaman James Dixon & James Freeman the Steward mid & latter parts weather much the same let an other Boats crew go on liberty to day so ends this day
