Tuesday

March 29th

First of these 24 hours fine weather & light variable winds hands employed in various jobs bout decks sent down royal yards & repaired footropes to day mid & latter parts weather the same so ends this day

Wednesday

March 30th

First of these 24 hours fine weather & light B northerly winds hands employed in various jobs bout decks let one Boats crew go on liberty to day mid & latter parts rainy so ends this day

Thursday

March 31st

First of these 24 hours cloudy weather & passing showers sent another Boats crew on liberty to day mid & latter parts weather the same so ends this day

Friday

April 1st

First of these 24 hours fine weather & light S E wind hands employed getting off. Potatoes & storing them away the crew all came off except David Senner he was looked up for causing disturbance this morning was tried & fined & sentenced to three months imprisonment let an other Boats crew go on liberty to day so ends

Saturday

April 2nd

First of these 24 hours fine weather & light variable wind hands employed in various jobs bout decks mid & latter parts the same let another Boats crew go on liberty to day

April 3rd

First of these 24 hours cloudy weather & strong N W wind watch all came on board at sunset mid & latter parts blowing heavy with rain so ends this day

Monday

April 4th

First of these 24 hours fine weather & westerly wind mid & latter parts the same so ends this day

Tuesday

April 5th

First of these 24 hours fine weather & light S W wind hands employed bout decks mid & latter parts the same so ends this day

Wednesday

April 6th

First of these 24 hours fine weather & southerly wind hands employed setting up rigging mid & latter parts weather much the same so ends this day

Thursday

April 7th

First of these 24 hours fine weather & light S E winds hands busy employed bout decks mid & latter parts the same so ends the Cooper attempted to desert last night but was caught & put in chains

Friday

April 8th

First of these 24 hours fine weather & light southerly wind hands employed bout decks at 4 P.M. got under weigh & halled fathles out mid part squalling latter part fine weather so ends this day

Saturday

April 9th

First of these 24 hours fine weather & Easterly wind hands employed in various jobs bout decks mid & latter parts weather the same & lost a Cooper & Boatstainer & D. Head forward the Cooper went on shore to day and deserted

Sunday

April 10th

First of these 24 hours fine weather & S E wind mid & latter parts weather much the same so ends this day the Carpenter & J. Gordon off duty sick
