June 27th
Wednesday. First of these 24 hours strong southerly
wind employed getting provisions from shore
and stowing it away mid & latter parts fine weather
Antone Piner remains but the same so ends

June 28th
Thursday. First of these 24 hours fine weather & light

variable wind employed getting off potatoes
and filling water mid & latter parts the same
employed stowing water so ends this day

June 29th
Friday. First of these 24 hours fine weather & light
variable wind employed stowing water mid
& latter parts weather the same so ends this day

June 30th
Saturday. First of these 24 hours fine weather & light
southerly winds employed in various jobs
but deck set up for stays to day so ends

July 1st
Sunday. First of these 24 hours fine weather & southerly
wind from Rodriguez deserted last night while
on shore for a run so ends this day

July 2nd
Monday. First of these 24 hours fine weather & southerly
wind mid & latter parts weather the same

July 3rd
Tuesday. First of these 24 hours fine weather & light
southerly wind mid & latter parts equally so ends

July 4th
Wednesday. First of these 24 hours fine weather with passing
showers mid & latter parts the same so ends this day

July 5th
Thursday. First of these 24 hours fine weather & light wind
mid & latter parts weather the same moved
ship further out in the stream the California
went out to day

July 6th
Friday. First of these 24 hours cloudy weather & strong
N.E. wind mid & latter parts blowing a gale with much
rain so ends this day

July 7th
Saturday. First of these 24 hours blowing hard from N.E.
with much rain dropped 2nd anchor at 4 P.M.
mid part the same latter part cloudy and calm so ends this day

July 8th
Sunday. First of these 24 hours cloudy weather & calm mid
& latter parts strong N.W. wind so ends this day

July 9th
Monday. First of these 24 hours fine weather & strong N.W. wind
mid & latter parts calm. Antone Piner a little better

July 10th
Tuesday. First of these 24 hours fine weather & light variable
wind employed repairing sails mid & latter parts
blowing a gale from the North at 9 am dropped
2nd anchor so ends this day

July 11th
Wednesday. First of these 24 hours blowing hard from
N.W. with much rain mid part calm at 10 Am
a breeze sprang up from the westward weighed
anchor and came to sea. Mr. Senas came
of with the Captain he has shipped again 2nd Mate
also fetched off George Cooper who had been in
jail so ends this day no Oke

July 12th
Thursday. First of these 24 hours strong Westerly wind
R.H. steering by the wind heading N.W. mid & latter
parts blowing a gale took in all sail but lower
main top sail & staysails so ends this day
