March 9th

Sunday First of these 24 hours strong Northward by wind
B.H. steering W.W.W. saw 3 sail all going to the Eastward
at 10 P.M. raised 3rd night like at 6 P.M. took 2 1/2 tons of
to the anchorages & dropped anchor at half past 10 in 10 fathoms water

March 10th

Monday First of these 24 hours fine weather & light variable wind
mid & latter parts the same Capt went on shore this
morning hands employed washing & ship & doing
other jobs about the decks so ends this day

March 11th

Tuesday First of these 24 hours fine weather & light variable
wind hands busily employed mid & latter parts strong
& wind with rain cleared away at 6 A.M. began
at 7 to break out our Pump back Oil to sell so ends

March 12th

Wednesday First of these 24 hours fine weather & light variable
wind hands employed breaking out Oil mid & latter
parts raining so ends this day Robert Laps off duty

March 13th

Thursday First of these 24 hours light variable wind with rain
not much doing about decks mid & latter parts fine weather
employed stowing Cask for water the men came off today for
more food & liberty they were promised boat & went to
work again so ends this day

March 14th

Friday First of these 24 hours fine weather & light & E wind empty
filling Cask with water mid & latter parts weather much
the same so ends this day

March 15th

Saturday First of these 24 hours fine weather & light variable wind hands
employed in various jobs mid & latter parts weather the same
employed painting so ends this day

March 16th

Sunday First of these 24 hours fine weather & light & E wind
mid & latter parts thick weather so ends this day

March 17th

Monday First of these 24 hours thick weather blowing a gale from the North
our Pump back Oil was taken on shore today so ends 138 & 16

March 18th

Tuesday First of these 24 hours blowing hard from the Southward
employed breaking out water latter parts weather much
the same 40 P.M. off duty sick Robert Laps came on duty
today so ends this day

March 19th

Wednesday First of these 24 hours cloudy weather & westerly wind
hands employed stowing Cask for water mid part equally
latter part fine weather took 20 tons of water today from
a water Boat so ends this day

March 20th

Thursday First of these 24 hours fine weather & light Easterly wind
employed stowing Cask for fresh water mid & latter parts
the same so ends this day

March 21st

Friday First of these 24 hours fine weather & light Easterly wind
received 2 tons of Bread on board mid & latter parts
fine weather received on board 2 1/2 tons Flour so ends

March 22nd

Saturday First of these 24 hours fine weather & light Easterly
wind mid & latter parts weather much the same Capt came on
board today & soon went on shore again took on board 18
tons more water Mr. Semast. Mr. Jones went on shore today

March 23rd

Sunday First of these 24 hours fine weather & light westerly wind
mid & latter parts weather much the same so ends this day

March 24th

Monday First of these 24 hours fine weather & light W & E wind
mid & latter parts weather the same hands employed setting
up head rigging so ends this day

March 25th

Tuesday First of these 24 hours fine weather & light W & E winds
hands busily employed mid & latter parts weather the
the same let 4 of the Moon one Boat & the Boy
go on shore today so ends this day

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
