Remarks Tuesday 13th of June A.D. 1848
This 24 hours begins with light moderate winds from the N.W. with all sail set a steering S.E. by E. and S.E. by E. with its pleasure all day employed in putting the rigging and making of spangars &c. saw fin backs and culphreen bottom what all sorts of ship's duties going on to end this 24 hours in the Lat by obs 31-48 South and Long by chron 85-53 W.

Remarks Wednesday 14th of June A.D. 1848
This 24 hours begins with moderate winds from the N.W. and N. from that to S.E. with the evening strong. Saw a plenty of fin backs employed in making Gysets. Saw 2003 albatross or geese we have got a bought all of the work done on the rigging and on the ship's also a good reminder a plenty of it a steamer. S.E. by E. ends this 24 hours in the Lat by obs 32-49 and Long by chron 86-05 W.

This 24 hours begins with strong winds from the N.W. & E. with all sail set a steering S.E. by E. and at 11 took in the main topgallant sail and at 1 took in fore topmast studding sail and at 6 set it again and parted the tack took it in again and putted a new tack and sheet and set it again employed in ship's duties at 11 took the topmast studding sail and at 3 took in the fore top of and put 2 reefs in the main top sail and at 5 took in main top gallant sail and at 10 put 2 reefs in fore sail and took in the mainsail and fore and at the same time took in
