Remarks Tuesday 20th of June Ann D 1848
This 24 hours begins with strong winds from the N N W
and from that to W with all sail set employed in
ordinary duties a smacking gale & a steaming S E by E
with it pleasant for the first time fore from 4 or 5
days but it don't look as if it was going to last long
Saw nothing So ends this 24 hours in Lat by obs and Long
by Chron 3-30

Remarks Wednesday 21st of June Ann D 1848
This 24 hours begins with strong winds from the N N W and
N N W with all sail set a steaming S E by E with some
strong squalls employed in ordinary duties a smacking and
tacking in sail Saw nothing at 5 P M put fore topsail
on the ship and brot out beef and pork So ends this
24 hours in the Lat by obs 37-11 and Long by Chron 6-10

Remarks Thursday 22nd of June Ann D 1848
This 24 hours begins with strong winds from W N W and
N N W from that to N a steaming S E by E with strong squalls
with fog and rain employed in ordinary duties making
and tacking in sail Some of the time all sail set and
some of the time short sail on at 7 P M hauled a sail
a steaming the same way that we was So ends this 24
hours in the Lat by obs And Long by Chron East

Remarks Friday 23rd of June Ann D 1848
This 24 hours begins with strong winds from the N N W
N N W with strong rain squalls or wind and rain saw a
sail employed in ordinary duties & a row off before
a gale with strong winds and rain a smacking
all of the 24 hours So ends this 24 hours with last weather
in the Lat of 38-05 South and Long by Chron 10 East for
the m

Whale Voyage to the Foxambique Channel ⁶

Remarks Saturday 24th of June Ann D 1848
This 24 hours begins with a gale of wind from N N W
blowing hard so that we hauled both a close reefed main
topsail and foresail and at 3 a m set the fore topsail
close reefed a steaming S E by E with strong squalls all
around the pumps at 1 P M had a white squall from
the S W and we took in fore topsail and foresail
and hove the ship too and at 5 P M wore ship and
set the fore topsail and for sail and 7 hauled a sail
and the same time set the mainsail and set and
all 3 of the topsails the fore and main with one
reef and the main hove employed in ordinary
duties So ends this 24 hours in the Lat by obs 38-23
And Long 16-10

Remarks Sunday 25th of June Ann D 1848
This 24 hours begins with strong winds from the S W
and cold a steaming S E by E and E S E with short sail
on the ship and sail in sight employed in ship
duties the weather some better than it was yesterday
at this time but how long it will last a loud knock
saw a plenty of whale birds but not probably at 12 P M
saw some 4 or 5 whales So ends this 24 hours in the
Lat by obs 37-21 S And Long 18-20 E

Remarks Monday 26th of June Ann D 1848
This 24 hours begins with strong winds from the N N W with all sail set
with ~~strong~~ squalls and the latter part of this 24 hours
the wind strong at 3 P M took in the main top gallant
sail and put 2 reefs in the topsails and took in the
fore with it a steaming strong from E N E with short
sail on the ship saw a sail employed in ship
duties a steaming S E by E saw porpoises the latter part
light winds So ends this 24 hours in the Lat by obs
37-56 S and Long by Chron 17-08 East
