Remarks Tuesday 15th of Aug An 1848
This 24 hours begins with light winds and baffles and
some of the time calm and very hot inappreciable in ship
duties a Geru Kingins the ship out side with 1000
and land saw a plenty of green parrots and some
back at 4 PM chased them but could not get up to the
boat 6 got on board again at the same time but
a light wind from the S. E. by E. with
it pleasant at 9 PM calm again so ends this 24 hours
in the lat 2 10 24 Long 51 E

Remarks Wednesday 16th of Aug An 1848
This 24 hours begins with light winds and baffles
and some of the time calm with it pleasant but some
what cloudy in ordinary duty at 8 AM got
out some small stores & at 2 PM got a light breeze from
the N. W. and S. E. from that to E. S. E. at 4 past 11 AM it
rained some 15 or 20 minutes and after
that it held up again at 5 PM saw land the ist of Jorham
and grays at 6 took in sail with the light so ends this
24 hours in the lat 18 Long 5

Remarks Thursday 17th of Aug An 1848
This 24 hours begins with light winds baffles and some
of the time calm with frequent rain squalls employed in
ordinary duty cloudy all day saw finchbacks & a stormy
all around the cummings and at 6 PM saw land again the
west light all the time to day with it thick all day
with squalls so ends this 24 hours in the lat 24 45
South and Long 60 East from Greenwich
in long 60

Remarks Friday 18th of Aug An 1848
This 24 hours begins with light baffles in clouds when
N. W. at 4 PM a breeze all around the cummings with
it cloudy all day inappreciable in ordinary duty at
6 PM saw land in the distance

Cruising around the Comoro and Zanzibar Isles

Remarks Saturday 19th of Aug An 1848
This 24 hours begins with light winds baffles from the
N. E. from that to S. E. and S. W. clearing all around
the cummings with the land about 15 or 15 miles
off saw hump back and one water spout employed
in ordinary duty at work at the chains & trying to
get the checks to work so that we could sleep at night
some of night or day had some rain & it was all and
some of the time calm got in the water in 15 or 15
miles so ends this 24 hours in the lat 15 29 Long

Remarks Sunday 20th of Aug An 1848
This 24 hours begins with light baffles winds from all
parts of the cummings with some rain and some of the
time calm but at 4 PM a light breeze and rain
cept off and rain for the ist with cloudy weather at
4 1/2 PM lowered the boats and began to tow and we were
undisturbed at 1 PM and then let go the anchor 15 in the
water the back Lewis of Salina Capt Jackson a French
Ship which went out at 4 PM the same time so
ends this 24 hours in the lat 15 29 Long 6

Remarks Monday 21st of Aug An 1848
This 24 hours begins with light winds baffles with it pleasant
all saw the Bay to a trying to work up the bay got off one
raft of water and hoisted the ship up under the land
saw a plenty of clover all day and a plenty of droid
with the natives all day this being the first day we had
a plenty of timber to look out for the natives but we
got along with our work employed all day at something
or other filled the boat 1 PM & so ends this 24 hours in
the lat 15 29 South coast in to the beach

Remarks Tuesday 22nd of Aug An 1848
This 24 hours begins with strong winds from the S. E. with
it pleasant all day at 9 AM the ship Briton Capt King 23 1/2
450 tons at the same time a down point in from Sunday
at 11 got in sight on shore again employed in lowering
down water and fitting ship stowed the hold at the
