on a Wednesday and our men have not much regard
for the Sabbath. Capt. to work all day go Ends this 24
hours with it pleasant all day in Port 7th Day

This 24 hours begins with light bafflen winds from all
parts of the compass with it cloudy all day on
watch on shore until noon and after dinner the
watch went on shore and employed in ordinary
duty go Ends this 24 hours in Port 8th Day

Remarks Tuesday 29th of Aug. 1848
This 24 hours begins with light bafflen winds and pleasant
all day employed in ordinary duty & all hands today in
readiness to sail got all of the things off the day but
the wind went fast go Ends this 24 hours in Port
9th Day

Remarks Wednesday 30th of Aug. 1848
This 24 hours begins with light winds bafflen with it pleasant
all day and at 3 AM got under way and got out to sea
and in getting under way we got down some of the
barque Jasper but no damage done at 4 PM saw a
brig a Stamping off and on shore employed
in ordinary duty & a towing the anchors and getting
the boats & saw porpoises go Ends this 24 hours
in the Port and Long East 10 AM and Long 24th Day

Remarks Thursday 31st of Aug. 1848
This 24 hours begins with moderate winds from the S E and
S E with it pleasant all employed in putting the rigging
all day saw a plenty of porpoises a Steaming E by land 6 AM
Gave down shortened sail the wind in fresh all day
go Ends this 24 hours in the Port 11 AM and Long by the watch
Coast from Greenwich in 8
