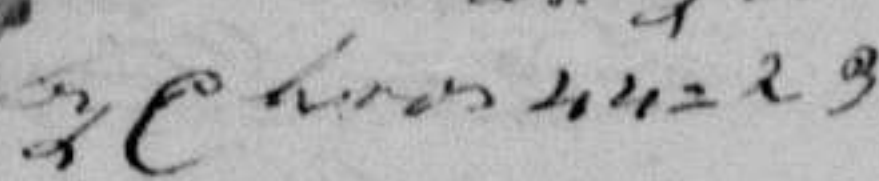


Ship Wm Lee of Newport M. S. P. Lee Master, A

162nd Remarks Friday 1st of Sept. Am. D. 1848
This 24 hours begins with light winds and squalls and some of the time also but cloudy some time employed in fitting the rigging & clearing E with the wind from the W the carpenter employed in fitting for the lower boat and the blacksmith in fitting her forge the band in sight all day. To ends this 24 hours in the lat by obs 11-33-15 and Long by Chron 44-38 East from G

163rd Remarks Saturday 2nd of Sept. Am. D. 1848
This 24 hours begins with light winds from N. E. W. and from that to S. and S. W. with all sails set & clearing E by S and E. E. with it cloudy all employed in ordinary duty & the blacksmith and carpenter at work all day saw nothing of any account. To ends this 24 hours in the lat by obs 11-29-5 and Long by Chron 44-38 East from G

166th Remarks Sunday 3rd of Sept. Am. D. 1848
This 24 hours begins with light baffled winds and some rain at 10 A.M. saw two sperm whales leaved and chased some 2 or 3 hours and at last we got fast to one whale and towed him up and at 3 P.M. got fast again to another and at 9 got them along side employed in whaling all day saw some 6 or 6 whales and 3 or 2 of them. To ends

167th Remarks Monday 4th of Sept. Am. D. 1848
This 24 hours begins with light baffled winds from all parts of the compass and at P.M. called hands and down began to get ready to cut and at 8 began to cut and at 11 got them in and began to clear up the deck and before sun down had the hands off from deck and at 9 P.M. began to haul down some of the line call To ends this 24 hours in the lat by obs 10-41 Long 44-38 East from Greenwich

168th Remarks Tuesday 5th of Sept. Am. D. 1848
This 24 hours begins with strong winds from the E and E. E. with it cloudy employed in boiling saw hump backs. To ends this 24 hours in the lat by obs 10-31-11

169th Remarks Wednesday 6th of Sept. Am. D. 1848
This 24 hours begins with strong winds from the E. E. and E. with some rain employed in boiling short sail on the ship & reefs in the topsails saw some fin back. To ends this 24 hours in the lat by obs 10-28-00 and Long by Chron 44-39 East from G

170th Remarks Thursday 7th of Sept. Am. D. 1848
This 24 hours begins with strong winds from the E. E. and E. with some rain squalls employed in boiling but at 10 A.M. got through a began to clear up the decks we got all of the work done at about 12 past 3 P.M. to ends hauling out 45 bls of gunn. To ends this 24 hours in the lat by obs 10-19-00 and Long by Chron 45-00

171st Remarks Friday 8th of Sept. Am. D. 1848
This 24 hours begins with strong winds from the E. E. with strong squalls and a heavy swell a running from the S. E. employed in ordinary duty at 2 P.M. hauled out the bottomed decks for heads and sweeps and got ready to tow down the 40 bls of oil. Gun at 4 P.M. began to hoist the barrow and at 5 got it all done. To ends this 24 hours with it blowing and raining with short sail clearing N. E. and N. E. E. employed in the lat by obs 10-30-30 and Long by Chron 45-29-20

172nd Remarks April the 24 1852
