Remarks Saturday 9th of Sept An^d 1848

This 24 hours begins with strong winds from the E & E with heavy squalls with rain however short sail a Steaming N & E and E & E employed in ordinary duty at work the carpenter and cooper at a patching up the toy works some few planks burnt through in sides of the works but we got them stoped up saw nothing all day a blowing strong with a heavy swell arising from the S & on a buoy to E & E Ends this 24 hours in the Lat by obs 62-28 and Long by Chron 46-20 East

Remarks Sunday 10th of Sept An^d 1848

This 24 hours begins with strong winds from the E & E with short sail and Steaming E & E the latter more moderate at 9 AM set all sail but single reefed fore and main topsails and top gallant sails yesterday afternoon would be done by noon by the account if apt to and if so we began to get up rigging but we got through with it at 4 PM to day on S & N yesterday employed in ordinary duty & all day to ends this 24 hours in the Lat by obs 5-31 S Long by Chron 47-00

184th

Remarks Monday 11th of Sept An^d 1848

This 24 hours begins with strong winds from the E & E and E & E Steaming S & E and E employed in ordinary duty & got on with the mended the flying jib and got 9 & 10 set the main top gallant sail and the fore and main top sail with one reef in main and at 6 PM Shortened sail came fore and main back to ends this 24 hours in the Lat by obs 5-41 S and Long by Chron 48-26 East from G

185th

Remarks Tuesday 12th of Sept An^d 1848

This 24 hours begins with strong winds from the E & E and a Steaming E with short sail at 8 AM set the fore and main topsails and main top gallant sail the carpenter and cooper at work saw few backs yesterday saw saw plenty of paper does to ends this 24 hours in the Lat by obs 5-30 S and Long by Chron 49-00 East from Greenwich

Remarks Tuesday 13th of Sept An^d 1848

This 24 hours begins with moderate winds from the E & E and a Steaming E by S with all sail set employed in ordinary duty & saw few backs the mechanics all at work Shortened sail at 6 PM to ends this 24 hours in the Lat by obs 59-1 S and Long by Chron 51-15 E

187th

Remarks Wednesday 14th of Sept An^d 1848

This 24 hours begins with moderate winds from the E & E a Steaming E by S with rain and fog employed in ordinary duty & all of the mechanics at work saw backs 3 or 4 times to ends this 24 hours in the Lat by obs 5-38 South and Long by Chron East 52-30 E

188th

Remarks Thursday 15th of Sept An^d 1848

This 24 hours begins with moderate winds from the E and E & a Steaming E by N and S & W were ship at 11 AM saw few backs the mechanics employed in ships duty at 6 PM Shortened sail to ends this 24 hours in the Lat by obs S and Long by C

189th

Remarks Friday 16th of Sept An^d 1848

This 24 hours begins with moderate winds from the E and E the latter part the wind strong with short sail on a Steaming E & E and from that to E by N with some rain the mechanics at work saw few backs to ends this 24 hours in the Lat 4-29 Long 52-10

190th

Remarks Saturday 17th of Sept An^d 1848

This 24 hours begins with moderate winds from the E & E with short sail with some rain equals the mechanics employed in ships duty all day saw few backs a Steaming E by N to ends this 24 hours in the Lat by obs 3-13 South and Long by Chron 54-10 East

191th

Remarks Sunday 18th of Sept An^d 1848

This 24 hours begins with moderate winds from the E & E with some rain the latter part pleasant but cloudy all day saw some small fish employed in ordinary duty & saw nothing
