G. with it pleasant all day but cloudy in the morning and at the forenoon and Steaming down again at 4 P.M. the low clouds changed but could not get in sight of them at 5 P.M. Shortened sail with the winds not so moderate saw a plenty of small fish and porpoises to ends this 24 hours in the Lat by obs 32=36 South and Long by Chron. 34=20 East

This 24 hours begins with light moderate breezes and the weather part strong from the S.E. with short sail and the ship a Steaming S. W. and E. S. E. employed in ordinary duty of Sawyer's tasks to ends this 24 hours in the Lat by obs 32=45 South and Long by Chron. 34=25 East

This 24 hours with light moderate breezes from the S.E. with all sail set a Steaming S. W. and S. by E. pleasant but cloudy saw few backs employed in ordinary duty at 4 P.M. began to put the fore royal rigging and mast to ends at 6 Shortened sail in the Lat by obs 32=41 South and Long by Chron. 34=18 East

This 24 hours begins with light moderate breezes from the S.E. with all sail set employed in turning up the main rigging at 6 A.M. saw a Quail and at 7 it proved to be an English merchantman saw a plenty of fin backs and porpoises to ends this 24 hours in the Lat by obs 32=48 South and Long by Chron. 34=04

Ends this 24 in the Lat 32=55 and Long 34=10 East

Remarks Tuesday 3rd of Oct. 1848
This 24 hours begins with light breezes from the S.E. and S.W. with all sail set employed in putting the rigging saw a plenty of small fish and porpoises with plenty all day at 6 A.M. saw a school of black fish and one fin back to ends this 24 hours in the Lat by obs 32=40 South and Long 34=20 East

This 24 hours begins with light breezes from the S.W. with all sail set a Steaming W. and W. G. W. with it pleasant at 6 A.M. saw land again the island of St. Vincent the Lat of 4=35 and Long of 35=55 by Bowditch saw a plenty of porpoises and cold fish and grampas a Steaming W. with winds light to ends this 24 hours in the Lat 32=35 and Long 34=00
