This 24 hours begins with moderate winds from E and S with it  
cloudy all day a steering E and W 9 AM with the land in sight  
cow isl. employed in ordinary duty and saw one sail at  
6 PM shortened sail So ends this 24 hours in the Lat by obs  
South and Long by chron  
202 D<sup>th</sup>

Remarks Thursday 26<sup>th</sup> of Oct. 1848

This 24 hours begins with moderate breezes from the SE and  
and SSE at 10 AM saw the isl. and saw black fish chains  
but got nothing employed in ordinary duty saw a plenty  
of porpoises So ends this 24 hours in the Lat by obs  
S and Long by Chron East

Friday 27<sup>th</sup> of Oct. 1848

This 24 hours with light breezes from the SE and SSE  
with it pleasant all day saw a whale and saw the harts  
from the other ship a chasing whale employed in  
hounding up the royal mast and yard forward  
at the same time saw the ship "H. Peters" take a  
whale along side and saw him a cutting at the same time  
saw a plenty of black fish So ends this 24 hours in the  
Lat by obs South and Long by Chron  
222 D<sup>th</sup>

Remarks Saturday 28<sup>th</sup> of Oct. 1848

This 24 hours begins with moderate breezes from the SE and  
a steering E and W 9 AM with it cloudy all day saw the  
H. Peters a sailing employed in putting the fish to the boat  
at 6 PM shortened sail put 2 reefs in the top sails and at  
11 PM it began to rain So ends this 24 hours with breeze  
in the Lat by obs 3-30 South and Long by Chron 52-20

Remarks Sunday 29<sup>th</sup> of Oct. 1848

This 24 hours begins with moderate breezes from the SE and  
with it cloudy all day and some rain employed in ordinary  
duty and at 10 AM and 2 PM saw fin backs and saw  
a sail to the windward So ends this 24 hours in the  
Lat by obs S and Long  
224 D<sup>th</sup>

Remarks Monday 30<sup>th</sup> of Oct. 1848

This 24 hours begins with light breezes from the SE and E  
with it cloudy saw hump backs employed in ordinary  
duty and at 8 AM on board the main top gallant  
sail and stepped a new cloth into it and at 3 PM  
sent it again at 6 shortened sail So ends this 24  
hours by  
225 D<sup>th</sup>

Remarks Tuesday 31<sup>st</sup> of Oct. 1848

This 24 hours begins with moderate breezes from the  
SE and S with it cloudy all day and some rain  
at 7 PM all sail a steering E and saw fin backs  
shortened sail at 6 PM So ends this 24 hours by  
226 D<sup>th</sup>

Remarks Wednesday 1<sup>st</sup> of Nov. 1848

This 24 hours begins with light breezes from SE and  
E and some of the time calm with the cow isl in sight  
and some porpoises and caught 2 sharks So  
ends this 24 hours by  
227 D<sup>th</sup>



Remarks Thursday 2<sup>nd</sup> of Nov. 1848

This 24 hours begins with moderate winds from E with  
some rain at 6 AM saw land again and at the same  
time got sail a steering W & Ward at 8 sent a  
new main top gallant sail and began to mend  
the old one and at 9 PM got on the banks and  
got Gown dings and got bottom at 8 fathoms and  
from that to 10 13 and 13 and in same places  
202 15 and 25 and at the same time caught a plen  
ty of bottom fish and most of them was red  
and caught 3 or 4 sharks So ends this 24 hours in  
the Lat by obs South and Long by Chron
