228 D<sup>th</sup>

Remarks Friday 3<sup>rd</sup> of Nov. 1848  
This 24 hours begins with light breezes an calm some of the time saw porpoise, and at 10 AM on bent the flying jib and mended it and bent it again at 1 PM with it plain all day but cloudy in the afternoon in ordinary duty. Saw nothing. So Ends this 24 hours in the boat. South and Long by chron East

Remarks Saturday 4<sup>th</sup> of Nov. 1848

This 24 hours begins with moderate breezes and rain. Squalls all day the wind buffing and a steering from W to E and at 6 PM put a reef in the topsails. Saw nothing all day of any amount employed in ordinary duty. So Ends this 24 hours in the boat. Long East

229 D<sup>th</sup>

Remarks Sunday 5<sup>th</sup> of Nov. 1848

This 24 hours begins with moderate winds from the East and the middle part heavy showers and a plenty of rain with lightning. Saw nothing but fin backs. So Ends this 24 hours under short sail the fore and main topsails furlled. Lat by obs. South and Long East

230 D<sup>th</sup>

Remarks Monday 6<sup>th</sup> of Nov. 1848

This 24 hours begins with strong winds and the latter part light and cloudy all day at 1 PM saw a whale and at 5 PM was to the seaward and we spoke him and at the same time saw 3 sperm whales. So Ends this 24 hours in the boat. Long



231 D<sup>th</sup>

Remarks Tuesday 7<sup>th</sup> of Nov. 1848

This 24 hours begins with light breezes from the E and with clouds all day and a steering E by N and from that to N by E at 4 PM saw 2 sails of some fin backs and black fish employed in ordinary duty. at 6 PM shortened sail. So Ends this 24 hours in the boat. South and Long



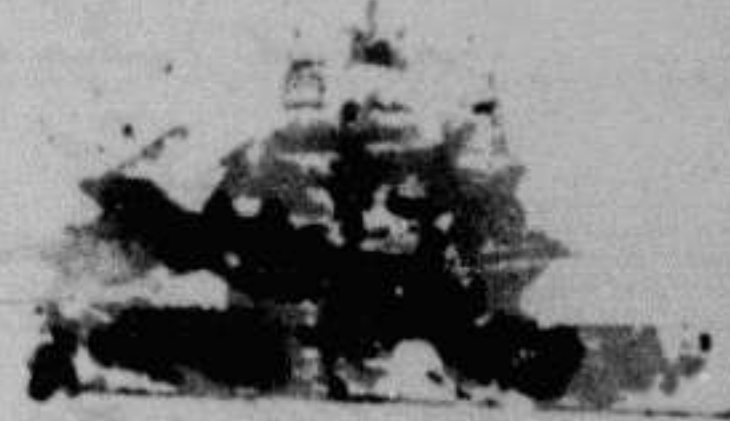

233 D<sup>th</sup>

Remarks Wednesday 8<sup>th</sup> of Nov. 1848

This 24 hours begins with light breezes from the SE and SE. Steaming E by N with one sail in light all day fin backs and some porpoises employed in ordinary duty all day. So ends this 24 hours in the boat. South and Long East



234 D<sup>th</sup>

Remarks Thursday 9<sup>th</sup> of Nov. 1848

This 24 hours begins with light and moderate breezes from the S and SE. With it cloudy all day but clear a steering to the westward and saw fin backs and some black fish employed in making a boat sail for the 1<sup>st</sup> boat at 9 PM. Saw land. So Ends this 24 hours in the boat. South

235 D<sup>th</sup>

Remarks Friday 10<sup>th</sup> of Nov. 1848

This 24 hours begins with light and moderate breezes from the SE and E. With it clear and pleasant all day at 1 PM saw 2 sails employed in ordinary duty. Saw porpoises at 4 PM past 6 shortened sail. So Ends this 24 hours in the boat. South and Long



236 D<sup>th</sup>

Remarks Saturday 11<sup>th</sup> of Nov. 1848

This 24 hours begins with moderate winds from the SE and E. With it pleasant but cloudy all day. Saw 2 sails employed in ship's duty all day at 6 PM made sail and a steering N by E nothing seen but fin backs and porpoises and 3 sails in sight. So Ends this day with land in sight in the boat. South and Long

237 D<sup>th</sup>

Remarks Sunday 12<sup>th</sup> of Nov. 1848

This day begins with moderate breeze from the S and at 6 AM made sail and stood along till about 1 PM past 2 PM ship hauled back but fin backs and porpoises to ends this day with 3 sails in sight. So Ends this 24 hours in the boat. South and Long
