This day begins with light breeze from the S by W and the ship a heading N. W. E. and putting down but grampuses and more ship about noon. To end this day with grampuses in sight in the L L E

Remarks Saturday 25th of Nov. 1848

This day begins with a calm and a clearing N. W. by N and the winds a blowing about 1 and the carpenter at work on the masts. To end with land in sight and grampuses in the L L N

Remarks Sunday 26th of Nov. 1848

This day begins with the winds moderate and a blowing from the S W and a clearing E. N. E. nothing in sight but grampuses. To end this day in the L L E

Remarks Monday 27th of Nov. 1848

This day begins with it calm and the ship a heading all around the compass and about 8 brook out and at 2 began to blow down. To end this day with land and grampuses in sight in the L L N

This day begins with the winds light a blowing from the S and the ship a heading S. All hands employed in making a deep sea line and the carpenter at work a putting up odd work and the carpenter at work and the day in the L L N

This day begins with winds very moderate a blowing from the westward and the ship a heading W. by N. and a school of blackfish were heard and struck once but the iron darts. To end this day with grampuses in sight in the L L W

This day begins with the winds moderate blowing from S. W. by S and the ship a heading S. by W. and at 2 brook out in the after hatch after masts and then stowed down the carpenter at work in the cabin raised a school of black fish about 2 o'clock. To end this day in the L L W

Remarks Saturday 2nd of Dec. 1848

This day begins with the winds in squalls a blowing from the S. W. and the ship a heading W. N. W. with rain with the carpenter at work in the cabin killed 1 pig and 2 chickens. To end this day with 3 fish in sight in the L L W

Remarks Sunday 3rd of Dec. 1848

This day begins with rain and equals with the winds about S. W. and the ship a heading N. N. W. with nothing in sight but porpoises. To end with the masts top sail never parted in the L L N

Remarks Monday 4th of Dec. 1848

This day begins with the winds moderate a clearing S. W. and the winds a blowing about N. W. with the carpenter at work in the cabin painting and water washing. To end this day with rain in the L L W
