This day begins with a moderate breeze from the N and the ship a heading N by E with nothing in sight all day. So ends this day with grasshoppers in sight in the S. L. E

Remarks Saturday 16 of Dec 1848

This day begins with winds light blowing from the N by W by S and the ship a heading N by W and about 10 o'clock raised some rollers and four facks. So ends this day with 2 cast and grasshoppers in sight in the S. Canal S. W

Remarks Sunday 17 of Dec 1848

This day begins with a moderate breeze from the S W from W and from that to N E. In grasshoppers and grasshoppers came rarely all day. So ends this day in the S. and S. W

223 D.

Remarks Monday 18 of Dec 1848

This day begins with a light breeze from the S W with nothing in sight but grasshoppers about 10 o'clock raised a boat with all hands employed in ordinary duties with the ship a heading W by N. So ends this day in the S. and S. W

224 D.

Remarks Tuesday 19 of Dec 1848

This day begins with a stiff breeze from the S by E and from that to S with the ship a heading S by W with it pleasant all day about 11 o'clock raised a school of rollers and rollers were ship about 4 post 3 about 4 post 10 raised cow island. So ends this day with the sand and a sail. So ends in the S. L. W

Cruising around the Banks and out for Ypsom 20

Remarks Wednesday 20 of Dec 1848

This day begins with rain till about 10 o'clock and then cleared away and was pleasant. The ship with the wind allowing from the S by E and from that to S by W and the ship a heading S by W about 11 o'clock raised a school of porpoises all hands employed in ordinary duties. So ends this day with the St Peters in the S. L. W

226 D.

Remarks Thursday 21 of Dec 1848

This day begins with the winds very light blowing from the N by W and from that to N W with the ship a heading N nothing seen but porpoises came under the bows but got none about 6 raised cow island and from that raised prelude or maybe about 10 took the flying fish down and we did it with all hands employed in ordinary duties. So ends this day with 2 islands and at ship all day long in the S. L. W

Remarks Friday 22 of Dec 1848

This day begins with a light breeze from N W with the ship a heading W with nothing in sight all day but land and sail at 4 post 10 but the flying fish all hands employed in ordinary duties. So ends this day in the S. And S. W

228 D.

Remarks Saturday 23 of Dec 1848

This day begins with a stiff breeze blowing from the N W a nothing seen but porpoises and land with the ship a heading S by W all hands employed in ordinary duties. So ends this day in the S. And S. W
