 This day begins with the winds stiff blowing from the N.W. and the ship heading W. and west by N about 9 A.M. the try works and tryed out the blubber cut about 1/2 past 10 raised a sail on the bow at 1/2 past 10 raised a sail at water past 10 broke out in the after hold and stowed down all hands employed in ordinary duties as per purposes in with water. So ends this day with a ship in sight in the S. and S. W.

 This day begins with the winds stiff blowing from the N.E. by N and the ship heading E. by S. about 10 raised a sail and about 11 past 11 raised a school of fish board but got none about 1 raised a sail in under the land about 6 had a gain with 2 barrels all hands employed in ordinary duties. So ends this day with 6 islands and 2 vessels in sight in the S. and S. W.

Remarks Friday 12th of Jan An D 1849
 This day begins with the winds stiff blowing from the N.W. and the ship heading N.E. about 11 past 6 went fore the wind and ran for cow island about 9 board for black fish but got none at 12 board a school of fish in past 2 board a gain for black fish got none all hands employed in ordinary duties and fishing. So ends this day with land and a sail in sight in the S. and S. W.

So ends this day with a sail in sight in the S. and S. W.

Remarks Sunday 14th of Jan An D 1849
 This day begins with all hands cutting in the wale with the winds blowing from the N.W. about 11 past 11 cut him all in with the hector to the land and a cutting in at 11 past 10 raised a school of black fish all hands employed in learing and cutting up bass peases. So ends this day in the S. and S. W.

Remarks Monday 15th of Jan An D 1849
 This day begins with a light breeze blowing from the N.W. E and the ship heading E all hands trying out with a sail to the windward about 11 past 11 more ship another bar but goes apases and porpoises. So ends this day with a sail and land in sight in the S. and S. W.

Remarks Tuesday 16th of Jan An D 1849
 This day begins with a stiff breeze blowing from N by W and the ship heading W by N about 9 A.M. ship and heading all hand employed in ordinary duties and boiling at 11 washed of decks and at 11 past 11 were ship again with a sail in sight. So ends this day in the S. and S. W.
