8 set up the fore top galeon and for top mast blocks set

was ran must to her side then hauled up on the wind
and stood along with her about 11 past 1 more 2 by
we were employed in towing down the main stay
at 6 P.M. took in sail So ends this day
in the L L E

parted went up and put it again at 12 more ship
