 a cooping the cask and about 9 P.M. showed down
 the empty cask at 2 o'clock of dark and then washed
 of darks so ends this day in the *Le*
 And *Le*

 Remarks Sunday 11th of Feb 1849
 This day begins with the winds light blowing
 from the N.W. the Ship a heading W and
 W by N the winds from N.W. about 10 P.M.
 porpoises came under the bow and got 4
 and then about 10th past 2 P.M. heard for black
 fish about 9th got none about 4 came on board and
 then raised anchor and stood a long so ends
 this day in the *Le* And *Le*

 Remarks Monday 12th of Feb 1849
 This day begins with it pleasant with the wind
 blowing from the N.W. and the Ship a heading
 W at 10th past 10 P.M. broke out cast from to repair
 about 9th went over the side to Scupper har line
 10th past 1 P.M. were ship and then went to look
 ship but the wind howl 4 p.m. and then shifted
 north again and then were ship again see nothing
 but porpoises and porpoises came under the bow
 and struck it but got none about 10th past 3 P.M.
 down a gun so ends this day in the *Le*
 And *Le*

 Remarks Tuesday 13th of Feb 1849
 This day begins with it raining the winds from
 from the S.W. and the Ship a heading W by N
 saying all day about 10th past 1 P.M. were ship with
 her a heading W and W by S at 2 the black Smith
 went to work with his forge a fitting the thinner

Cruising around the Banks and Is. for ³⁴ *Le*
 nothing seen all day about 10th past to look out water
 to repair 1 raised a good standing down to under
 so ends this day in the *Le*
 And *Le*
 3030 *Le*

Remarks Wednesday 14th of Feb 1849
 This day begins with it cloudy and squally
 the winds blowing from the W by N and the
 Ship a heading S.W. at 10th past 1 P.M. set the
 main top sail at 3 broke out cast 4
 for to repair about 1 P.M. the Ship a heading
 S.W. by E the winds about the same the watch
 impeded in churning down the masts
 and turning down the rigging about 3
 showed down again the black
 Smith at work with his forge
 about 10th past 6 were ship again so
 ends this day in the *Le*
 And *Le*

3031
 Remarks Thursday 15th of Feb 1849
 This day begins with it pleasant all day
 with the wind blowing from the N.W. and
 the Ship a heading S.W. by S with a swell
 to the windward a heeling at 10th past 1 P.M.
 set the fore top sail at 10 raised
 a small school of Spum Whales and
 went to the windward for them they sailed
 and went to the leeward the boats raised
 there all day till about 4 P.M. passed the 3 of
 them the iron derrick and lines fast of and on they
 got 2 the iron and West boat about 7th got her
 a long line so ends this day in whaling in
 the *Le* And *Le*

3032
 Remarks Friday 16th of Feb 1849
 This day begins with it cloudy all day at the
 plates of day began to cut in the whale about
 6 P.M. and ~~cut~~ cut in and then made sail
 and stood along with the wind a blowing
 from the N.W. by N and the Ship a heading
 East 3-11 S. by S. by S. by S.
