Remarks Saturday 18th of Dec. in 1848

This day begins with it moderate with the wind
blowing from the N. E. with the ship a heading
N. W. at day light raised land of our Lee beam
and the sail at 10 past 6 P. M. raised a school of
finch fish at 10 past 8 leaved and struck to
and pulled it but got none about 10 past 10 raised
ship and stood along for then and there were
around and stood along and then broke out
water the watch employed in clearing around
the try works at 2 P. M. raised 5 or 6 breaches
of our weather beam kept up for then made
then out grapples the boat steered at work
setting up then in at 4 worked of deck and
at 6 took in sail so ends this day with a
hail and land in sight in the S. S. S. S.

Remarks Sunday 19th of Dec. in 1848

This day begins with it cloudy and with a stiff
breeze blowing from the N. and the ship a heading
N. W. at about 6 P. M. raised a school of sperm
whales breaching at 10 past 8 leaved for then
at 10 past 10 to 1 and then 3 or 4 of them went
around and were coming down to sea about the
water was and then the other 6 leaved for then
to a couple 20 still breaching cows at 12 P. M. got them
a long side and at 2 began to cut them in but
at 4 cut 2 in and then reaped the for and
mended top 9. miles on the then breached up 8 so ends
this day with nothing in sight in the S. S. S. S.

Remarks Monday 20th of Dec. in 1848
This day begins with it cloudy and rainy with the
winds light blowing from the N. W. and the
ship a heading N. E. at 10 past 8 began to
cut in the other whale got him out in about 4
and then raised forced under short sail at
at 10 past 8 started fire in the try works and
at 8 made out a barrel of pork and kept something
raised but white water and breaches and land
all hands employed in cutting up horse pieces
and minding so ends this day in the S. S. S. S.

Remarks Tuesday 21st of Dec. in 1848

This day begins with it moderate till about
8 breeze up with the wind blowing from the
N. W. with the ship a heading N. W. at 6 raised
a school of finch fish at 10 past 8 broke out
provision at 12 P. M. raised a blow and
thought it was a sperm whale leaved and padd
up to the windward to see what it was found it
was a Sulphur bottom and then came on
board and stood along with land in sight
nothing seen but breaches and blows all
hands employed in minding at 6 took in
the main top galant sail and reaped
the for top sail so ends this day in the
Lat and Long

Remarks Wednesday 22nd of Dec. in 1848

This day begins with the moderate winds blowing
from the E. and the ship a heading N. W. at
day with us boiling about 3 got our boiler and
then cleaned the tubs and at 4 P. M. washed of
decks there 3 whales turned us 85 lbs nothing
seen but breaches blows and porpoises at 6 took
in the fore top galant sail and flying sail so
ends this day in the S. S. S. S.
