Remarks Friday 23 of Dec. An D 1848

This day begins with a calm till about 10 o
clock it breezed up from the N by W and the
Ship a heading W by N at 11 past 5.30 sent out
in the main hole to blow down sail at the
same time raised a sail and sail at 12
raised our Island nothing seen but porpoises
and grampuses and black fish all hands employed
in blowing down sail got blowed down about 12
past 5 P.M. drove off ducks at 5.30 in the
air top galant sail and flying sail So Ends
this with our ~~Land~~ in sight in
the Lat And Long

Remarks Saturday 24 of Dec. An D 1848

This day begins with it pleasant with
light winds blowing from N.W. and the
Ship a heading S about 11 past 6 P.M. raised
a School of sperm Whales of our lead beam
weighter Squad of four then a little
ways and then hulled up on the wind
at 8.30 board and chased them at quarter of
11 got up to 1 at 11 past 1 got him along side
and made her fast rigged the falls and
out here in and then whistled of decks the
hands in boyed in muzzing and cutting

Remarks Sunday 25 of Dec. An D 1848

This day begins with the winds light blowing
from the N by E and the Ship a heading S
standing in for the islands raised a sail at
day light hoisting at 11.30 sent out the
same time the mate man did the flying sail
the capt went on board then were Ship and
stood away from the islands all hands employed
sailing and muzzing at 5 P.M. killed a shark
and at 6 raised a School of black fish this
whole makes with lands at sun down took
in sail the brig Leonides of Newport 6 months
out 115 lbs So Ends this day with Land and
a sail in sight in the Long And
Long

Remarks Monday 26 of Dec. An D 1848

This day begins with it equally and going
with double reef top sail till about 8.30
sent the reefs and strain for the Land
all hands cleaning the Ship at 11 washed up
decks at 12 past 2 the main boat went on to
to deers island and got some provisions
and 2 pigs at 4 got up the key and fire boat
on and put it over the bows and then sent
on the land ball anchor at about 6 took in
the main top galant sail and flying sail
So Ends this day Steaming for Land
in the Lat And

Remarks Tuesday 27 of Dec. An D 1848

This day begins with a stiff breeze Steaming
for the Islands at 11 past 10 sent away
the Land ball greater boat to Sea where the
port was at 11 past 12 got back again and
then stood along fore the port at 2 got
