 This day begins with it calm at 4 p.m. & breaks  
 out a breeze of punk at the same time breaks out  
 water about 11 o'clock a breeze came up blowing from the  
 S.W. and the ship a heading W.N.W. with the  
 cooper and carpenter at work all hands employed  
 in ordinary duties nothing seen but green pusses  
 at 6 took in sail So ends this day in the L  
 And L

Remarks Friday 6 of April 1845  
 This day begins with a light breeze blowing  
 from the W.N.W. and the ship a heading S.W.  
 at 6 raised sail at 4 p.m. & the cooper and  
 carpenter at work all hands employed in  
 ordinary duties nothing seen but green pusses at  
 4 took in sail and then washed up  
 at 6 took in sail So ends this day in  
 the L And L

Remarks Saturday 7 of April 1845  
 This day begins with a light breeze blowing  
 from the N.W. and the ship a heading N.W.  
 at about 6 o'clock raised Denis's land and  
 our sea how at the same time raised sail and  
 moving the flying jib at 4 p.m. & the black  
 Smith went to work on the forges and the  
 carpenter at work on the windlass. So  
 ends this day with land green pusses  
 porpoises and black fish in sight in  
 the L And L

Remarks Sunday 8 of April 1845  
 This day begins with it cloudy and the  
 wind a blowing from the S.E. and  
 the ship a heading S.W. all hands employed  
 in ordinary duties at 10 raised a sail to  
 the windward at 2 raised around the gamb  
 at 4 broke out water So ends this  
 day in the L And L

Remarks Monday 9 of April 1845  
 This day begins with it cloudy and windy  
 the wind a blowing from the N.W. and  
 the ship a heading S.W. at day light raised  
 a sail to the leeward another to the windward  
 at 6 o'clock the black Smith went to work on  
 the forges at 4 p.m. & broke out water in the  
 fore hold all hands employed in ordinary  
 duties at 11 raised land ran to Denis's land  
 till 4 p.m. & then took ship at 4 washed up  
 decks at 5 p.m. & 5 p.m. with the hope of seeing  
 Bedford Capt. Pierce 14 mtd cut 500 lbs the  
 George Porter 12 mtd 230 lbs So ends this  
 day sailing in the L And L

Remarks Tuesday 10 of April 1845  
 This day begins with it cloudy and a  
 stiff breeze blowing from the N.W. and  
 the ship a heading S.W. with the hope of  
 head standing in for the land at 4 p.m.  
 & took ship at 11 raised with water of our  
 sea hanna man of to it but did not make  
 out what it was  
 at 2 raised a school of black fish porpoises  
 and green pusses at 4 p.m. & 3 held a pig at 4  
 washed up decks So ends this in the L  
 And L

Remarks Wednesday 11 of April 1845  
 This day begins with it pleasant and with a  
 light breeze blowing from the N.W. and the ship  
 a heading S.W. with 2 sails in sight going about  
 the same as we was all day at 8 p.m. some curves  
 around the mainmast at 10 broke out and the main  
 hatch after a catch of fish took out a main sail and  
 main top sail  
 at 4 p.m. & 1 held up the mainmast the watch seeing  
 the main top sail at 4 sent it at the same time
