This day begins with it cloudy and with a light breeze
blowing from the N.E. by E and the ship a heading
N by E with 2 sails in sight to the seaward at 6 o'clock
about the mainmast about 9 o'clock I sent a new wash
sail the watch is working on the main sail and the
carpenter at work a making a span plank today
at 4 o'clock up the main sail at the same time raised
a school of whales heard away but got none the ~~water~~
can or board at sun down took in the fore and mizen
top galant sail So Ends this day with 2 sails and
Bilens in the L

Remarks Friday 13 of April A.D. 1848

This day begins with it calm and pleasant and a
sail of our bar and beam at the same time broke
out water and bread at report went to work on the
main sail all day
at report we hauled for black fish but got none
a plenty of porpoises and grasspusses about 9 o'clock
a breeze came up blowing from the N.W. and
the ship a heading N at 1 o'clock washed of decks So
Ends this day with a sail and grasspusses in sight
in the L

Remarks Saturday 14 of April A.D. 1848

This day begins with a calm all day with the
breeze in sight at report went to work
on the main sail at 9 o'clock broke out hail
and melasses in the after haul at report
10 showed down again

at 3 set up the flying jib stay at 4 o'clock up
main sail then washed of decks nothing seen
grasspusses and porpoises So Ends this day

with a sail and passes in sight in the L
and L.

at 6 o'clock in the fore and mizen top galant sail
flying jib So Ends this day in the L
and L

grasspusses and porpoises So Ends this day
in the L and L

from the S.W. and the ship a heading N.W. by E
at report I mended top sail ahead at the same
time went to work on the mizen top sail at 4
