rain employed in mending sail at 11 P.M. a steering
at 1 P.M. with 2 reefs in the top sails at 6 took in sail
with it a blowing & raining at 6 ends this 24 hours in the boat by obs. South by S.

Remarks Thursday 30 of May 1849
This 24 hours begins with a gale of wind & baffling from S.W. to S.E. with
with a steady rain all day the latter part of the day the rain
the ship under short sail at 8 P.M. saw a bark at 9 P.M. saw
saw nothing like whales employed in mending sail at 11 P.M. saw
ends this 24 hours in the boat by obs. South by S.
