Remarks Monday 23<sup>rd</sup> of July Aug 1849

This 22 hours begins with moderate breeze blowing from S to S E & S E fresh  
it pleasant at 10 A.M. saw some isd of the Fox packet at 12 one boat went on  
there after eggs & fish came on board at 4 P.M. shortened our sail at 6 P.M.  
they & we did not 22 hours in Lat South of Long East of Ching

Remarks Tuesday 24<sup>th</sup> of July Aug 1879

This 24 hours begins with the moderate breeze from the S.E. with all sail set  
at 6 A.M. saw Whale & at 6 lowered & chaised untill 11 & then came on  
board & got something to eat & at 2 P.M. chaised again & at 3 got  
fast & at 4 got him along side & took in sail  
we ended this 24 hours in lat<sup>o</sup> 36 Long S.E. 3.3.50 W.B.

Remarks Wednesday 25th of July Aug 9 1849

This 24 hours begins with a clear sky from the S. & S. E. & pleasant. At 12 o'clock began to cut & at 12 got through & at the same time saw a sail & at 1 o'clock spoke the ship. At 1.30 Captain Branton, R. S. commenced hoisting at 7 o'clock ends this 24 hours. L. D. S.

Remarks Thursday 26<sup>th</sup> of July 1849.

This 24 hours begins with a moderate breeze from the S. E. with it  
pleasant at 6 A.M. saw whale & down boat & chased it at 7 got far  
to one & the line parted & we lost it at 9 we got along side of a  
another & before the boat started the whale struck & got out  
of the way so we chased untill 11 A.M. & came on board & at 12 A.M.  
saw the ship get one & at 3 P.M. chased again but got nothing  
ends this 24 hours Lat 33-34 - South & Long 136-138

Remarks Friday 27<sup>th</sup> of July Ann. 1849

This 24 hours begins with high breezes from the S & with some rain (Saw)  
the bark Gilgopher, bottoms employed in boiling a clearing with  
some sail set also ends this 24 hours in the heat. Aug 25

Remarks Saturday 28<sup>th</sup> of July Aug 1849

This 24 hours being with light breezes from the N. E. with some rain & fog, we got through boiling at 5 A.M. & cleared the ship & got all through by 10 A.M. Sulphur bottoming of the bark a boiler & a En. at the 24 hours in the Lat. about 45° N. & a steering S. W. by S.

Cruising around the Banks & Isle of Longferry 1829

Remarks Sunday 29<sup>th</sup> of July Aug. 1849

This 24 hours begins with light breeze from the N.E. with it calm some of the time & some rain pleasant the most of the time I am firing back 300. Employed my ship, shot & porpoises at 6 P.M. I shortened sail 10. Only this day, however in Lat East & Long Lat by Chron.

Remarks Monday 30<sup>th</sup> of July Ann D 1847

Thus 24 never begins with moderate winds from the  
SSE with us a flowing down at 9 A.M. raised a gail of  
our weather saw nothing but fine Luckin light at sun down  
got down flowing down To End this 24 hours in Lat  
South 8 Long West by C. H. W.

Remarks Tuesday 31<sup>th</sup> of July. An D 1849

This 24 hours began with a stiff breeze from the  
S.E. with us a lurching deck about 4 past 2 A.M. a sail of  
our lee bow standing up for us about 9 past 4. raised another  
of our lee beam. at 12 P.M. tacked Ship, grampuses and breaches  
seen &c. Ends this 24 hours in Lat South 8 Long East  
3 (over)

Remarks Wednesday 1<sup>st</sup> of Aug. 1848

This 24 hours begining with a strong breeze from the S.W. with  
it pleasant with no sails in sight at the same time an English ship  
I had up accost and told me she was at 8 M. made out  
water at 10. Tacked ship and stood along at 3 P.M. the larger got  
2 at 6 P.M. took in sail. So ended this ~~24~~ 24 hours in the
