This 24 hours begins with it cloudy with light breeze at 8 A.M. it rain with 6 sails in light with all hand at work all day plenty of small fish at 9 past 5 P.M. we came up at 6 P.M. took in the gill So Ends this 24 hours in the S South & S

This 24 hours begins with strong breeze from S & E with us sailing with 6 sails to the haward all day with all hands employed in cutting and minding a plenty of small fish in sight about 10 A.M. took out in the After-hold for empty casks an snolines and fell at 3 hrs down took in sail So Ends this 24 hours in the S South & S

This 24 hours begins with a strong breeze from S & E with us sailing with the mack at work clearing up at 5 past 11 made sail with us running free all day at 11 past 1 P.M. raised a shower of the weather then call it a sulphur bottom

at 4 P.M. broke out water at 7 past 5 P.M. raised a school of black fish at 6 took in sail then was ship So Ends this 24 hours in the S South & S

This 24 hours begins with a strong breeze from S & E at 7 past 5 P.M. call all hands at 9 past 8 A.M. hoisted out bread and powder and put it down the after hold then towed down sail with it raining all day with us under short sail sailing in light at 9 past 6 put a reef in the main top sail So Ends this 24 hours in the S South & S

This 24 hours begins with a strong breeze from S & E with it cloudy with us towing down sail at 7 past 9 P.M. raised a breeze of our weather bar. made the fore top sail at 9 past 10 A.M. a school of porpoises across the mid ocean 60 lbs & riders at 1 P.M. got down the fore top sail then were ship So Ends this 24 hours in the S South & S
