This 24 hours begins with it cloudy with a S.W. breeze
blowing from the S.W. with us hailing at 9 past
5 noon Ship about 11 raised dunn Island at 1/2 past
4 raised 500 bluffs on the northern shore bound
and pulled up their anchor were hauled about 4 past
3 more raised dunn Island at 6 took in the fore
top Sail So Ends this 24 hours with us hailing
in the S South & S
E by E

Remarks Thursday 18th of Oct An D 1849
This 24 hours begins with it cloudy but pleasant with a
S.W. breeze from the S.W. with us hailing up about
1/2 past 12 noon Ship made sail about 10 raised
dunn Island about 1/2 past 12 noon raised a sail of
our own hand about 1/2 past 3 raised another sail this
2 sails made about 65 lbs at 3 hours for black fish
got none at 5 am dunn general with the hope So
Ends this 24 hours in the S
South & S

Remarks Friday 19th of Oct An D 1849
This 24 hours begins with it cloudy with us running for
the wind with the wind from the eastward with the
Sails in sight all day the carpenter at work on the
boat at 12 left on the wind about 1/2 past 3 raised the
Islands at 1/2 past 4 then held on the wind at the same
time the 2 vessels gunnery at 6 took in sail So
Ends this 24 hours in the S
South & S

Remarks Saturday 20th of Oct An D 1849
This 24 hours begins with it calm and cloudy with
us beginning to stow down all with the Sails in
sight about 1/2 past 12 it rained at 1 got through stow
ing down checked up the the main hatches then

63 Spurn
Crossing across the Banks and 1st for
washed of deck then breised round the yards
round with the wind from the S.E at 1 took in
sail So Ends this 24 hours in the S
South & S

Remarks Sunday 21st of Oct An D 1849
This 24 hours begins with it cloudy with a moderate breeze from
the S.E with us laying a back raised forward and made
sail with nothing in sight at 9 noon Ship steaming west
about 10 raised a sail of our own hand for back in sight
at 1/2 past 12 ran for white water did not make out so it was
left to her care about 1/2 past 12 took out a barrel of pork at 6 took
in sail So Ends this 24 in the S
South & S

Remarks Monday 22nd of Oct An D 1849
This 24 hours begins with it cloudy with a moderate
breeze from the S.E with the Sails in sight at 8 took
out water with gunnery or porpoises in sight at 1/2 past 12
P.M. the cooper and carpenter at work so Ends this
24 hours with the Sails in sight in the S
South & S

Remarks Tuesday 23rd of Oct An D 1849
This 24 hours begins with it calm with the Sails in sight
at 1/2 past 12 in the fore sail and never did it with
the cooper and carpenter at work at 1/2 past 5 he did
it again So Ends this 24 hours with the Sails in
sight in the S
South & S

Remarks Wednesday 24th of Oct An D 1849
This 24 hours begins with a moderate breeze from the
S.W. with the Sails in sight at 1/2 past 5 took out
down in the lower hole with the cooper and carpenter
at work nothing seen all day at 1 the wind held to the southward
more So Ends this 24 hours with the Sails in sight
