This 24 hours begins with it cloudy with a light breeze from the S by E the macker at 10 o'clock in sail with 2 sails in sight at 1 o'clock of deck at 4 o'clock in sail then gale with the hope so ends this 24 hours in the S

Remarks Friday 26th of Oct An D 1849

This 24 hours begins with a light breeze from the S by E with 2 sails in sight about 10 o'clock in sail then a squall of our weather here with it hauled out in the afternoon to 3 o'clock sail at 4 o'clock began to storm down at the same time hauled out water at 6 o'clock in sail with us run free so ends this 24 hours with the island in sight in the S

Remarks Saturday 27th of Oct An D 1849

This 24 hours begins with a stiff breeze from the S E at day light more ship with us beginning to storm down oil at 4 o'clock & raised a man a head at 8 o'clock with the hope and pulled all day but did not get him came on board at 10 o'clock in sail so ends this 24 hours with the hope in sight in the S

Remarks Sunday 28th of Oct An D 1849

This 24 hours begins with a stiff breeze from the S E with it cloudy at 1 o'clock began to scrape the decks about 2 o'clock a whale of our bow took ship for hope then hauled her back down the boat got up to him but never fastened about 11 o'clock raised the hope of our weather here at 4 o'clock took ship then hauled up the main sail for the hope to come down at 6 o'clock gale with her so ends this 24 hours in the S

This 24 hours begins with a stiff breeze from the S made sail with the hope to the windward about 5 o'clock was making about 4 o'clock & we took ship with us storming down at 4 o'clock took ship again at 4 o'clock & got down then began to swell deck at 6 o'clock in sail with the hope to the windward so ends this 24 hours in the S
