The Liberator commenced publication on Tuesday
morning. It was a ship sailing at 11 PM
spoke the ship citizens of Massachusetts. I
had cord friends at 1 PM and a dead whale
killed the Liberator that went to it and
returned it to the same day.

Foggy commenced over weather cutting in the
middle at 4 P.M. finished commenced boiling
middle part rain and fire water part
the same as usual
