

At Sunrise on the third of march

At ten o'clock that Day

Then just at night we saw sun more
Good luck I do declare
We got a forty barrel bull
And had another fair

Same Day while cutting in our whale
A boat the out of three
The ship two brothers then we spoke
And kept her company

Then crossed to gather of and on
Till March the thirteenth Day
Our two survivors went on board
Next morn they left away

For Valparaiso they were bound
Provisheans there to buy
Crucis one month or more and then they were
Bound home immediately

Two on the nineteenth Day of March
For port we bore away
And in to Valparaiso the three and twentieth Day
Nine Days we lay at anchor there

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Potatoes we did buy
Of Apples Pears and Cape Horn Nuts
We got a good supply

The water where we anchor here
In this Extensiv Bay
Was five and twenty fathoms Deep
The bottom mud and clay

The harbor here is all exposed
Unto a northern gale
And in the winter Season here
They ^{often} always do prevail

The southerly breezes begin to blow
In the later part of the Day
Then ships at anchor in the Port
May safe at anchor lay

When you are bound in to this port
Upon your Starboard hand
You will see a rock just off the point
About forty rods from land

The water around is very Deep
Your ship may wafted be
As near that Rock that off the point
Half length from danger free

The first of April we set sail
And left the Spanish Shore
With a good breeze we steered to
Go try our luck once more
April the one and twentieth Day
We saw the straits once more
And then to gather we did mate
As we had done before
