top Sails, and strong breeze
through the night strong
breeze at day light begin
trying at 6 A.M. saw a Rak
supposed to be a brig the Wal
Wather logged and had nothing
standing but the stumps of her
masts at the same time saw
a school of sperm Whales
hauled after her with out
success

Lat obs 37° 45' and
Long of obs 46 59 W

Tuesday 5

Begins with strong breeze
from West Wore ship to the
S.W. Employed in cutting
up junk & trying out oil
saw several sail standing
to the Eward at 3 P.M.
lay with the main top sail aback
head to the S.W.
through the night squally
at 3 spoke a brig

Tuesday 5

August 1828

From Martineco sailed to
Tyres, almost calm
saw strong appearance of
a strong current
made sail to the E.S.E.
Light breeze from the S.W.
all hands busily employed
in trying out oil

Lat obs 37° 39' S. ^{47° 21'}
and Longitude 47° 11' W

Wednesday 6

Begins with light breeze from the
Wward standing E by S under
top sails and fore sail
Employed in trying out oil
observed considerable to have
run out in the Blubber room
at 8 A.M. finished the Boddy
and commenced on the head
a fine breeze set the top of sails
and fore top mast studding sail
at meridian saw a large
sperm Whale young fast to wind
ward No Lat Long of account ^W 18
