28th out

Begins with Pleasant weather
at 10 AM Standing towards the
Land at 4 PM saw 3 vessels
at anchor under the Isle of Sal
Sent a boat to the found them
to be in gale made sail to
the S and at 10 PM saw
Bonne Vista through the
light and light under the
Land at 8 AM spoke
the Ship Mercator of St
Bedford 270 Bannock oil
Landed a boat and went
in to the harbor for the
purpose of landing home oil
but with out success

23rd
29th out

The 24th
30th out

Saturday August 23 1828
Begins with fine weather
at 10 AM
Returned on Board and made
sail to the Westward
through the Night Wind baffling
and latter part of the Day Calm
Saw a sail to the Westward
supposed to be the mercator
Begins with Calms
at 4 PM a Light breeze from
the S W took to the E and
Letter Rock leaving by 10 miles at sunset
observed and found the variation
to be 19 = 41 W
through the Night nothing
remarkable but almost Calm
at 8 PM took the Wind at
E and Run between the
Islands of May and 1st August
at meridian Lat 15 15 N
